TRANSGENDER TREND: Parents questioning the trans narrative

Global group of parents develop research-based website to challenge the transgender diagnosis of kids

Transgender Trend is a group of parents from the UK, US, and Canada who have joined forces to launch an organisation dedicated to sharing research and information which challenges the 'transgender' diagnosis of children. Our organisation has set up a website as an alternative source of information for parents, to balance the overwhelmingly one-sided view currently available online.

Transgender support groups typically send out the message: 'if your child says they're trans, they're trans, just support them.' Parents need to know that most kids will not turn out to be transgender; they just don't conform to gender stereotypes, or they will actually turn out to be gay or lesbian. In the last few years, a completely new diagnosis has appeared; we're encouraging kids to believe they are the opposite sex, and very few people are questioning it. These kids will end up as medical patients for life. Who is benefitting from this?

The website features peer-reviewed scientific research studies and statements from professionals, as well as evidence of the risks and side-effects of treatment, which in the case of prepubescent children, may include life-long sterility. We also plan to publish a blog, and aim to provide information which differentiates between younger kids and teens, since the rationale for the 'trans' diagnosis varies depending on the age of the children involved

There is a difference between a little boy who looks around and sees that all the toys he likes are labelled 'for girls,' and a teenage girl who has been immersed in all the Reddit and Tumblr trans forums online, all encouraging her to define herself as trans. Nobody is examining the reasons behind this global surge in the number of 'transgender kids.'
